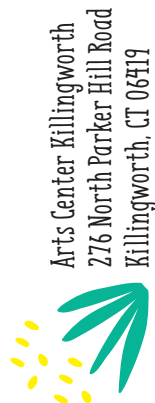

Sketch floral and landscape scenes, and, as a special treat, enjoy a **Guest Artist Session on Painting/Drawing Trees and Foliage in Watercolor!** Develop observational, drawing, and sculpting techniques working on projects like Air Dry Clay Impressions, Bubble Painted Florals (mixed media), Nature's Windows Clings, and Sun Painted Sun Catchers. Nature will inspire, as will the included visit to Spectrum Gallery in Centerbrook!

DAILY DRAWING*

Children begin their sessions drawing en plein air on the grounds of the Arts Center. Young artists conceptualize trees, shrubs, water and land into geometrical shapes using descriptive lines. As they refine their drawing skills, they will appreciate the abundant and varied shadows, light and textures Nature offers the eye.

Air Dry Clay Impressions

Observing, drawing and collecting specimens out in the field, students then work with rolling pins to capture floral and leaf impressions within the clay.



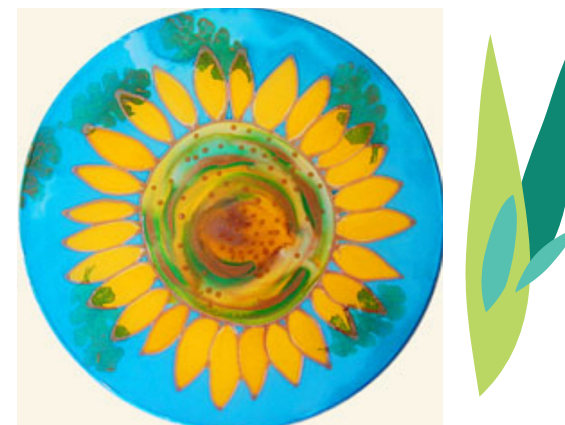
Bubble Painted Florals

Who doesn't love to blow bubbles? Using watercolor, cut leaf paintings, and a little creativity, Students assemble a mixed media Floral collage.



Nature's Window Clings

Students capture all of the magical colors in nature as they create a montage using items found while foraging on the grounds of the Arts Center.



Silk Painted Sun Catchers

Students fill their sun catchers with a single flower head using the Serti method. Students then draw an outline of their flower using Gutta, to create a border to paint within.
